Commitment to electric safety

MAY IS National Electric Safety Month, a good time to reflect on how your cooperative promotes electrical safety. Somerset Rural Electric Cooperative (REC) goes to great lengths to keep you, your family and our employees safe. Whether it is increasing awareness in the community or educating cooperative employees on the dangers of their jobs, Somerset REC is committed to promoting the highest standard of safety.

High voltage wires and equipment are a constant danger for cooperative lineworkers and can also pose a danger to cooperative members and others. This is why continuous electrical safety education is so important.

Line crews participate in monthly training sessions and courses held on-site, which remind employees of the safety aspect of the job and the importance of using equipment in the safest manner possible. They are also encouraged to attend various Job Training & Safety Schools conducted by the Pennsylvania Rural Electric Association (PREA), the statewide association representing the 14 electric cooperatives in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

Another important program
Somerset REC participates in is the
Rural Electric Safety Achievement
Program (RESAP). RESAP is a national
safety program administered by the
National Rural Electric Cooperative
Association (NRECA) in partnership
with PREA. This program provides

electric cooperatives with a framework for continuous improvement in safety performance and culture at all operational levels, from lineworkers and office staff all the way up to senior leadership and the cooperative's board of directors. RESAP focuses on building leadership commitment, increasing employee involvement and providing honest feedback for continuous improvement.

How does the program work? NRECA provides an online module for RESAP area administrators to monitor the progress at each participating electric cooperative. The program is comprised of five steps:

- 1. Leadership commitment This step encourages the CEO's active participation and dedication to a culture of safety.
- 2. Safety health check Cooperatives complete this to help them make an internal evaluation of their safety practices.
- 3. Safety performance measures Cooperatives provide performance measures of key data annually.
- 4. On-site observation visit Conducted every three years, the on-site visits allow the observation team to gain as much knowledge as possible about the day-to-day operations of the cooperative and provide constructive feedback.
- 5. Safety improvement plan —
 The plan is updated or developed
 to give cooperatives a platform to
 document safety improvements, involve

Joshua C. Sechler represents District 8 and




